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Self Regulation

École Whitehorse Elementary staff have been exploring self-regulation in the school environment as one of our two School Growth Plan goals. This has been taking many forms. Many of the classes have been practicing Mind Up in the classroom. This is one way students are

learning to focus and be calm to ready themselves for optimal learning. When students need to 'up' their energy level, they are invited to eat, jump on a trampoline, or maybe perform a few exercises. When students need to 'calm' their energy level, they are encouraged to use fidget tools, wiggle cushions, therabands, yoga, rock in the quiet corner or sit in a tent.

Ask your child what is happening in their class.



Food for Thought: Video Games and Natural Opiates

Biederman and Vessel (2006) have published an important study on the pleasurable "fix" of natural opiates that are released when we solve a problem. Their research raises the possibility that the more time one spends playing certain video games, the more time playing will be required in

subsequent sessions to reach the same level of enjoyment. This, in turn, might reduce the pleasure experience in less stimulus-rich activities such as reading. (Shanker, 2013. Calm, Alert and Learning)

Attention Parents of Grade 4 & 7 Students

The Yukon <u>Foundation Skills Assessment</u> (Yukon FSA) is an annual territory-wide assessment of Yukon students' academic skills, and provides a snapshot of how well students are learning foundation skills in Reading Comprehension, Writing, and Numeracy.

The main purpose of the assessment is to help the department and schools evaluate how well students are achieving basic skills, and make plans to improve student achievement. FSA is designed and developed by British Columbia educators. The skills assessed are linked to the provincial curriculum and provincial <u>performance standards</u>. The assessment is administered annually to Grade 4 and 7 students in public and provincially funded independent schools.
